

In this newsletter the classes are sharing news about their work, including their current class text.


Starling Class

This half term we have been learning about animals who hibernate in the autumn and exploring how our natural environment looks different in the winter.

We have enjoyed learning about Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate the 5th November with fireworks. This led to some fantastic firework art where we used pastels to show bright vivid colours.

In science we have been exploring the different materials we use and see in our every day lives and sorting if they are natural or man-made.

On top of this lovely learning we have been practicing our Nativity play which we are very excited about performing!



Kingfisher Class

Kingfisher class have been working very hard this term. In English we have explored The Iron Man by Ted Hughes, writing our own Newspaper reports, including Headlines, column, picture and captions etc...

We have recently started a poem project looking at Poems that help to express our emotions, the children are loving learning poems off by heart! In Maths we have focused on understanding number, particularly our times tables. Our topic-based work has explored Kenya, its animals, people and landscapes and we are currently busy making our Christmas cards using our knowledge of pulleys and levers from D&T. We have become true scientists investigating all that is forces and magnets!

Peregrine Class

Peregrine class have been productive in all areas of the curriculum this term. The children have written amazing finding tales that have used relative clauses and speech to enhance the story. In maths, we have been focusing on the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and are currently having a boost on our times tables knowledge in order to support all areas of the maths curriculum. During the afternoons, the children are improving their sewing skills in order to make some Christmas presents for their friends and families. Also, we are continuing to develop our historical knowledge by researching the Stone Age and contrasting how people lived then to today. The class have taken great pride in their work, thinking about presentation choices and flourishing in all areas of the curriculum - I am very proud of you all.

Attendance



We know that good attendance leads to good outcomes for children. Children learn best if they are in school regularly and avoid gaps in their learning. We have set ourselves an ambitious target to achieve at least 95% this year. We have slipped just below target which is unfortunate and the spell of Chicken Pox has not helped so it would be great if together we can get back up to target. You can help us do this by minimizing the number of sessions your child misses each year. No one can help being poorly and it is important to stay at

home if you are sick, but other absences such as holidays or appointments should be avoided, wherever possible.

Free School Meals

Is your child entitled to free school meals? Please note this is different from the universal free school meals that children in Starling class receive.

Parents and carers who receive any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Income Support (IS)
- Employment and Support Allowance (Income Related)
- Universal Credit with an annual household income of less than £7400 after tax
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit, with an annual taxable income (as assessed by HMRC) of less than £16,190

It is the responsibility of the parents or carers to register their entitlement and request free school meals for their children.
