Updates from the classes

Starling Class

In Starling Class, the children have been learning about Mary Anning and why she is an important woman in history. In English, the children looked at the story of Mary Anning through the text *Stone Girl, Bone Girl.* They discovered what fossils are, where they can be found, and which creature Mary and her brother famously discovered. They children also enjoyed making their own fossils using salt dough! In science, the children have been exploring mini beasts, understanding what makes an insect an insect, and making micro habitats.




Kingfisher Class



In English, the children have enjoyed exploring the book *Arthur and the Golden Rope* by Joe Todd-Stanton. We have used this as a stimulus to create our own persuasive adverts and comic strips. In Maths, the children have been expanding their knowledge of larger numbers up to 10,000. In Geography, the children have continued to deepen their understanding of rivers with a focus on the River Parrett and the impact of flooding in our local area. As scientists, they have focused on light, sound, and electricity, discovering how light and sound travel, the use of electricity, and then used this knowledge to link to their D&T by creating simple circuits and switches.

Peregrine Class

Peregrine class have had a very busy half term. In English lessons, the children have been reading *Runaway Robot* by Frank Cottrell Boyce (the current children's laureate). Through this text, we have developed the children's grammar knowledge of active and passive voice, formal language, standard English, as well as the correct use of colons and semi-colons. The children have used this as a stimulus to write journals, formal letters, and persuasive pieces. In Maths, we have continued to develop the children's multiplication and division skills as well strengthening their understanding of decimal numbers. In the wider curriculum, the children have been finding about evolution and how Darwin and Wallace are key scientists in this field. In Art, the children have been sculptors inspired by the work of Danny Osborne, whilst in Computing, they have been creating their own games using their knowledge of coding.

Free School Meals

Is your child entitled to free school meals? Please note this is different from the universal free school meals that children in Starling class receive.

Parents and carers who receive any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Income Support (IS)
- Employment and Support Allowance (Income Related)
- Universal Credit with an annual household income of less than £7400 after tax
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit, with an annual taxable income (as assessed by HMRC) of less than £16,190

It is the responsibility of the parents or carers to register their entitlement and request free school meals for their children.
